- ◆ **Educating parents** on the effects of divorce on children
- ◆ **Helping parents** find ways to minimize the harmful effects of divorce.
- ◆ **Teaching parents** skills and providing practical advice on ways to assist their children.



What Kind of Class Will I Be Attending?

Children in the Middle explores the issues of divorce and separating through a group format, facilitated by a parent educator. This format is designed for parents who are experiencing mild to moderate levels of parental conflict.
